

1. ICADR - Introduction

The International Centre for Alternative Dispute Resolution (ICADR) was registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 on 31st May, 1995. It is an autonomous organisation with its Headquarters at New Delhi and Regional Centres at Hyderabad and Bengaluru. It has been established to promote, popularise and propagate alternative dispute resolution methods to facilitate early resolution of disputes and to reduce the burden of arrears in Courts. The objectives of the Society, *inter alia*, are as follows:

- 1. to promote studies in the field of alternative dispute resolution (ADR) and allied matters, and to promote reform in the system of settlement of disputes.
- 2. to undertake teaching and to provide for diffusion of knowledge of law and procedures on ADR and related matters and to award diplomas, certificates and other academic or professional distinction.
- to impart training in ADR and related matters to those who are handling arbitration, conciliation and mediation;
- 4. to promote research and documentation in the field of ADR and publish books, periodicals, reports and other literature covering ADR;
- 5. to organize Conferences, seminars and study groups on issues concerning ADR;
- 6. to provide facilities and administrative and other support services for holding conciliation, mediation, mini-trial and arbitration proceedings;
- 7. to maintain panels of appropriate persons competent and qualified to serve as arbitrators, conciliators and mediators, or willing to serve in any other specialist capacity such as experts, surveyors and investigators;
- 8. to cooperate with other societies, institutions and organisations, national or international, in the pursuit of all or any of the above objectives;
- 9. to constitute Regional Centres at convenient places in India and abroad to promote the activities of the Society;
- 10. to draw up and prescribe rules of the Society for different modes of ADR.

The ICADR was inaugurated by the then Prime Minister of India on 6th October, 1995.

2. Organisational set up of the ICADR

- 1. The General Body of the Society It is composed of all the Members of the Society.
- 2. The Governing Council of the Society It is composed of the following:
 - (i) All the Foundation Members
 - (ii) Two Members elected by the Corporate Members from amongst themselves.
 - (iii) One Member elected by the Associate Members from amongst themselves.
 - (iv) Fifteen Members elected by the Life Members from amongst themselves.
 - (v) Five Members elected by the Ordinary Members from amongst themselves.
- 3. The Chairperson of the Society;
- 4. The Secretary General of the Society;
- 5. The Secretary; and
- 6. Such other authorities as may be constituted by the Governing Council.

3. Sources of Finance

Sources of funds for the Centre are initial corpus and other grants from the Government of India/State Governments, public and institutional donations and grants from International organisations, Membership fees, administrative fees, Facilities charges, etc.

4. Rules and Bye-laws framed and adopted by ICADR

- (a) The ICADR Arbitration Rules, 1996 (including provisions for Fast Track Arbitration)
- (b) The ICADR Conciliation Rules, 1996
- (c) The ICADR Mini-Trial Rules, 1996
- (d) Rules and Regulations
- (e) Financial Bye-laws
- (f) Service Bye-laws
- (g) Bye-laws for Regional Offices

5. <u>Committees</u>

For efficient functioning of the ICADR and wider participation of Members, the Governing Council of the ICADR has constituted the following Committees, namely:-

- (i) Finance Committee
- (ii) Research Advisory Committee
- (iii) Appointments Committee
- (iv) Building Committee
- (v) Empanelment of Arbitrators Committee
- (vi) Screening Committee for Membership
- (vii) Activities and Publicity Committee
- (viii) Committee to consider suitable amendments in the Rules of the ICADR.

The Members of the Committees include judges, eminent lawyers, scholars, academicians, arbitrators, conciliators, etc. These Committees meet from time to time and provide necessary guidance to the ICADR in the discharge of its functions smoothly and efficiently.

6. Membership of ICADR

In terms of the Rules and Regulations, the ICADR has the following categories of the members and the number of members at present against each category are as under:-

7. Arbitration Cases

(i) The Centre at New Delhi has so far received 49 cases for arbitration (including 4 International Commercial Cases) and 4 cases for conciliation. The Arbitral Tribunals have

disposed of 42 Arbitration cases (including 4 Commercial International Cases) and hearings in remaining 7 cases are in progress. All four Conciliation Cases have been disposed off.

(ii) As mentioned in the last year's Annual Report, ICADR was requested to administer the international commercial case between Ministry of Defence, Government of India and Denel (Proprietary) Limited, South Africa, for the purpose of receipt of Arbitrator's fees and their disbursement, etc. ICADR had opened an Escrow Account with the State Bank of Patiala, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi. This account is still being operated by the Secretary-General of International Centre for Alternative Dispute Resolution (ICADR). It is understood that the Arbitral Tribunal in the said case is being reconstituted.

ICADR has been approaching Public Sector Undertakings and Corporates for inclusion of its Arbitration/Conciliation Clauses. As a result the following cases have been referred to ICADR for appointment of Arbitrators/Administering the cases in Financial Year 2015-2016:-

- 1. M/s. Fertilizers and Chemicals Travancore Limited (FACT) and M/s. LOTS Shipping Ltd.
- 2. M/s. ARSS Damoh-Hirapur Tolls Private Ltd. and M/s. Madhya Pradesh Road Development Corporation (MPRDC) Ltd.
- 3. Union of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Department of Family Welfare and M/s. Council for Economic and Social Research (CESR)

The Arbitration Halls at the offices of the Centre at New Delhi and Hyderabad are being utilised frequently by the Government Departments, PSUs and Private parties for conduct of Arbitration Cases on payment of nominal charges by the parties. Since October 2005 till 31st July, 2016, 708 hearings by different Ministries and other parties and 434 hearings by Arbitrators appointed by ICADR in various cases have taken place in ICADR's Headquarters building. Similarly 789 hearings by Arbitrators have taken place in Regional Office Hyderabad from 1999 till July, 2016.

8. Regional Centres

One of the main objectives of the ICADR is the dissemination of knowledge of the Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) system and with this end in view, it was considered necessary to establish Regional Centres of ICADR in State Capitals. The ICADR has since established two Regional Centres, namely, at Hyderabad (now common Union territory of

States of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana) and Bengaluru in Karnataka, with the financial and other assistance of the concerned State Governments. It may be mentioned that Parliamentary Standing Committee on Personnel, Public Grievances, Law and Justice, in Para 4.42 of their 39th Report had made recommendations to the Department of Legal Affairs for making grant-in-aid to ICADR for setting up of Regional Offices of ICADR at Mumbai, Kolkata and Chennai. In this connection ICADR approached Department of Legal Affairs for grant of Rs. 10 crores in the Financial Year 2010-11 to establish two Regional Offices – one each in Mumbai and Chennai. However, there has been no response so far from Department of Legal Affairs.

The ICADR Regional Centre, Hyderabad got Corpus Grant of Rs. 35,20,000/- from the Sate of Telangana in the financial year 2015-2016.

9. Construction of Phase II of the ICADR's Headquarters Building

ICADR Headquarters, had received total grant-in-aid of Rs 15.75 crores upto Financial Year 2013-2014 from Ministry of Law and Justice, Department of Legal Affairs towards the construction of the ICADR's Phase II buildings. The total grant-in-aid of Rs. 15.75 crores received by ICADR has been paid to CPWD for the aforesaid construction work of Phase II buildings. The Civil work including internal Electrical work, work of HVAC, Fire Fighting and Lifts etc. has been completed. NOC from Chief Fire Officer for fire fighting system is awaited. The work of Supply, installation, testing and commissioning of Digital Conference Systems and Audio Video Systems in the Auditorium is in progress. The said construction work is likely to be completed by the end of 2016.

The proposed new building will consist of an Auditorium having approximately 200 seats designed on the pattern of Vigyan Bhawan, a Convention Centre, arbitration rooms, mediation rooms with break-away rooms for separate meetings with both the parties. The new buildings of ICADR will provide a decent infrastructure having latest facilities like Video-conferencing, Transcription, etc., for holding hearings not only in domestic arbitration and mediation cases but also in international commercial arbitration and mediation cases under one roof in New Delhi.

The present Administrative Block Building of ICADR Headquarters is well equipped to provide the facilities of International standard for conducting arbitration, mediation/conciliation cases. The building has three Rooms for hearing Arbitration/Mediation cases, Waiting Lounge for Arbitrators/Mediators, Secretarial Assistance, Xerox and Fax facilities etc. The Rooms are well equipped with latest Public Address System to make the hearings

easy and convenient and are available for hearing at nominal charges. Since October, 2005, 1142 hearings have taken place in these rooms.

As mentioned in last year's Report the portions of the Administrative Block Building of ICADR which were not required immediately, have been temporarily rented out on lease to facilitate the maintenance of the building and to also generate necessary funds for promotion of ADR activities by ICADR.

10. <u>Conferences/Seminars/Workshops/Training Programmes/Lectures/Diploma Courses</u>

The ICADR organised the following Training Programmes/Conference/Seminars/ Workshops/Lectures/Diploma Courses during the year:-

- (1) ICADR, Headquarters organized 40 hours i.e. five days' Mediation Training Programme on 30th, 31st May & 1st June, 2015 and 19th & 20th June, 2015 in its office Premises. Against proposed 30 seats 31 Trainee Delegates attended the said course. The participants came from different parts of the country including Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Punjab & Haryana, Uttrakhand and Delhi. The Training was imparted by our own CEDR trained Faculty comprising of Mr. Justice I.P. Vasishth (Retd.), Ambassador R.S. Rathore (Retd.) and Supreme Court Lawyers, Mrs. Mandira Mitra and Mr. M.S. Doabia. The methodology of the Training comprised both theoretical as well as practical demos including participative exercises by the Trainee Delegates. Without exception the delegates enjoyed the Training and provided the Feedback of high value satisfaction.
- (2) ICADR, Headquarters organized Arbitration Training Programme from 24th–26th July, 2015 in Hotel Deccan Plaza, Chennai in association with SOFADS. The said Training Programme was inaugurated by Hon'ble Mr. Justice S.K. Kaul, Chief Justice of Madras High Court on 23rd July, 2015 at Hotel Vivanta by Taj-Connemara, Chennai. The said inauguration Programme was also attended by some sitting and retired Judges of the Supreme Court and Madras High Court. Mr. B. S. Saluja, Secretary-General, ICADR, Mr. Justice I.P. Vasishth (Retd.), Consultant, ICADR and Dr. T. K. Viswanathan, Director (ADR), ICADR and Senior Advocates also attended. The Training was given by ICADR's faculty members namely, Mr. Justice I.P. Vasishth (Retd.), Consultant, ICADR, Mrs. Mandira Mitra and Mr. M.S. Doabia Advocates practising in High Court/Supreme Court. 37 persons attended the said Programme and were awarded Certificates.

- ICADR, Headquarters in association with Centre for Alternative Dispute (3)Resolution, Jindal Global Law School, organized Seminar and Panel Discussion on Investment and Commercial Arbitration in India: Prospects and Challenges" on 23rd September, 2015 in India Habitat Centre, New Delhi. ICADR also hosted Dinner on the same day at India Habitat Centre. The Guests of Honour at the said programme were Hon'ble Dr. H.R. Bhardwaj, Former Governor of Karnataka and Chairman, ICADR, Hon'ble Mr. Justice A.K. Sikri, Judge, Supreme Court of India, Hon'ble Mr. Justice A.P. Shah, Former Chairman, Law Commission of India and Mr. Ricardo E. Ugarte, Partner, Winston and Strawn, LL.P., Geneva. There were four Working Sessions in the said Programme on topics relating to Investment Claims Against India: Past Present and Future, The New Model BIT and its Discontents, The Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 – A Reform Agenda and Prospects of Institutional Arbitration in India. Mr. P.K. Malhotra, the then Law Secretary, Ministry of Law and Justice, Chaired the Session on Investment Claims Against India: Past Present and Future. The programme was addressed amongst others by Mr. B.S. Saluja, Secretary-General, ICADR, Professor (Dr.) C. Raj Kumar, Founding Vice Chancellor, O.P. Jindal Global University and Dean, Jindal Global Law School, Mr. Shishir Dholakia, Senior Advocate, Supreme Court of India and Member, Governing Council, ICADR, Dr. T.K. Viswanathan, Director (ADR), ICADR and Member, Governing Council, ICADR, Dr. K.N. Chaturvedi, Former Secretary, Legislative Department and Member, Governing Council, ICADR, Mr. A.K Ganguli, Senior Advocate and Mr. Justice I.P. Vasishth (Retd.), Special Invitees to Governing Council, ICADR.
- (4) ICADR, Headquarters organised Conference on "Arbitration, Conciliation and Mediation" on 28th November, 2015 at Lucknow. It was inaugurated by Hon'ble Mr. Justice A.K. Sikri, Judge, Supreme Court of India. Welcome Address was given by Mr. B. S. Saluja, Secretary-General, ICADR. The said Conference was also attended and addressed by Hon'ble Mr. Justice D.Y. Chandrachud, the then Chief Justice, High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Dr. H.R. Bhardwaj, Former Governor of Karnataka and Chairman, ICADR, Hon'ble Mr. Justice N. Kumar, the then Judge, High Court of Karnataka and Executive Chairman, ICADR Regional Centre, Bengaluru, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Dinesh Maheshwari, Senior Judge, Lucknow Bench, Mr. Ajay Thomas, Director and Registrar, LCIA India, Mr. Justice I.P. The said Conference was also attended and addressed by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Dalveer Bhandari, Judge, International Court of Justice, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Madan B. Lokur, Judge, Supreme Court of India, Dr. H.R. Bhardwaj, Former Governor of Karnataka and Chairman, ICADR, Mr. P.K. It was also attended by Hon'ble Members of the Governing Council of ICADR and other delegates.
- (6) ICADR, Headquarters Co-sponsored the ICCA-Summit on "Arbitration in India Way to Go" held on 5th March, 2016 at Scope Complex, New Delhi. Mr. B.S. Saluja, Secretary-General, ICADR attended the Inaugural Session of the said programme and also gave a Concluding Address/Vote of thanks. The said programme was also attended and addressed by Mr. P.K. Malhotra, the then Union Law Secretary and Member, Governing Council, Mr. Ashok Sharma, President, ICCA and Treasurer, ICADR and Mr. Ratan K. Singh, Advocate and Director CIArb. Mr. S.K. Dholakia, Senior Advocate and Member, Governing Council, ICADR was speaker in first Session on "Is India the next hub of International Commercial Arbitration". Mr. Justice I.P. Vasishth, (Retd.), Consultant, ICADR was one of the speakers in second working session on "Is Institutional Arbitration the answer to what ails Indian Arbitration regime".
- (7) ICADR, Regional Centre, Hyderabad organized a Workshop for Judicial Officers and Advocates on Alternative Dispute Resolution in association with Telangana State Legal Services Authority, Hyderabad and District Legal Services Authority,

Medak on 4th and 5th April, 2015 in District Court of Medak. The Programme was inaugurated by Dr. G. Radha Rani, Chairperson, District Legal Services Authority, Medak. It was also attended by Smt. A. Bharati, V Addl District & Sessions Judge, Sangareddy, Mr. P. Venkata Ramana Rayulu, VII Addl District & Sessions Judge, Smt. M. - (4) Alternative Dispute Resolution Centre, Kochi, Kerala for promoting ADR in Kerala and jointly organising training Programmes/Seminars/Conferences on Mediation and Arbitration and also undertaking Research Studies in the field of ADR.
- (5) ICADR has also entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with Jindal Global Law School, O.P. Jindal Global University, Sonipat, Haryana, India to jointly promote the learning and teaching of ADR methods and research therein by developing new Courses and organising various Workshops, Seminars, Conferences, Training Programmes etc. in the field of ADR.

12. Library

Books are essential tools of the lawyers, judges and arbitrators. The ICADR has well equipped library containing books of Indian and foreign authors. A number of new titles have been added to the existing library. In addition, a number of periodicals and journals are also being subscribed.

Regional Office at Hyderabad is also maintaining a good library and several important titles were added during the year to the said library.

ICADR has subscribed to SCC Online – Web Edition. On this site one can view full text of judgments of Supreme Court and High Courts, Federal Court, Privy Council, information relating to Arbitration, Tribunals and Commissions like Customs, Excise and Service Tax Appellate Tribunal (CESTAT), Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)/SAT, Income Tax Appellate Tribunal (ITAT) etc. One can also view Central Bare Acts/Rules, Bills and Ordinances in Parliament, Circulars and Notifications of different Ministries, etc.

The facility to view this site is being provided by ICADR to its Arbitrators/Conciliators/Mediators and Members.

13. After 31.3.2016

- 1. ICADR, Headquarters organized a five days' Intensive Mediation Training Programme at its own premises in New Delhi from 2nd to 6th June, 2016. Against proposed 30 seats 31 Trainee Delegates attended the said course. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES & NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

1. OVERVIEW OF THE SOCIETY'S OPERATIONS:

The International Centre for Alternative Dispute Resolution (ICADR) was registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 on 31st May, 1995. It is an autonomous organization with its Headquarters at New Delhi and Regional Centres at Hyderabad and Bengaluru. It has been established to facilitate early resolution of disputes and to reduce the burden of arrears in Courts. The Society is committed to promote studies, research, training in the field of alternative dispute resolution (ADR) and allied matters

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 BASIS OF ACCOUNTING:

The Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India are applicable to non-profit entities, only if any part of the activities of the entity is considered to be commercial, industrial or business in nature. The Society is not carrying on any activity in the nature of commercial, industrial or business. Therefore, the Accounting Standards are not mandatory and have been followed to the extent practicable or relevant. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and on cash basis except stated otherwise. The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Society.

2.2 FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation except land, which is stated at cost. Cost of fixed assets purchased out of specific purpose funds is added to the Capital Fund by debiting the relevant fund account. Those purchased out of own sources are appropriated from Income and Expenditure account and added to Capital Fund.

Depreciation is calculated on straight-line method at the rates prescribed in the Income tax Act, 1961.

2.3 VALUATION OF INVESTMENTS

All investments are stated at cost

3. NOTES

- 3.1 The Society is registered under Societies Registration Act, vide Regn. No. 5/27983 of 1995 and also registered with the Commissioner of Income-tax under section 12A vide Regn. No. 100/95-96 dated 26-07-1995 and under section 80 G vide Regn. No. DIT(E) I 2011-12/347 dated 31.05.2011.
- 3.2 The Society is registered with the Ministry of Home Affairs under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976 vide FCRA No. 231650771(Replaced by Foreign Contribution Regulation Act 2010)
- 3.3 The Society has deposited an amount of Rs 11,44,879/ with BSES Rajdhani Power Ltd as per requirements of that Company. The said amount is being treated by that Company as Security Deposit and it is adjusting interest payable on the said Security Deposit in the Electricity Bills.
